- 10 Then a cloud appeared and covered them, and a voice came from the cloud: 'This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to Him!' Suddenly, when they looked around, they no longer saw anyone with them except Jesus.

- 11 As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus gave them orders not to tell anyone what they had seen until He had risen from the dead. They kept the matter to themselves, discussing what 'rising from the dead' meant.

- 12 They asked Him, 'Why do the teachers of the law say that Elijah must come before the Saviour, the Messiah?'

- 13 Jesus replied, 'Elijah does come first, then the Son of Man must suffer and be rejected? But I tell you, Elijah has come already. The disciples understood by this that Jesus meant John the Baptist.'
